Creating a simple, accessible and visually stimulating overview is the main target of the poster abstract (See the examples provided)


Example 1



Risk factors, histopathological features and graft outcome of transplant glomerulopathy in the absence of donor-specific HLA antibodies.




Patients with Transplant Glomerulopathy (TG, N=98)










CONCLUSION:

TG often occurs in the absence of HLA-DSA and represents a different phenotype with better graft survival compared to TG in the presence of HLA-DSA. PIRCHE-II score and eplet mismatches did not associate with TG development.





- Identification and isolation of yeast and mold in contaminated milk products samples (A-B)
- Molecular characterization of mycotoxins (C)
- Collection of marine algae samples for extraction of their constituents (D)
- Treatment of the cultured fungi samples (i.e. Aspergillus) with the algal extracts and detection of inhibition zones (E).

Recording and submission guidelines



- 1. Presentations are limited to 2 minutes
- 2. Zoom recording/ PowerPoint recordings are allowed
- 3. Filming should be done horizontally with the presenter appeared in the righthand top corner of the poster view
- 4. Recording should be done in a static position.
- 5. A single static slide is permitted in the presentation (no slide transitions, animations, or 'movement' of any description).
- 6. Submissions via MP4 format only. Files sent in other formats will not be accepted (Submissions can utilize Zoom Meetings recording feature or use MS PowerPoint for example).
